Secrets of Contesting: The Flow State

Orange, CA, October 17th, 2022 – From time-to-time, we've convinced ourselves that contesting adds to our youth, and cognitive skills, and we simply could not excel at contesting if we weren't "young". And that reasoning has sometimes worked to convince our significant others that we really really do need to fly to that far-off Indian Ocean island next week for CQ WW SSB: "its guaranteed that high speed talking for 48 hours will lengthen the period before dementia sets in" (an N6TJ quote).

Now, we can attest that there's some truth to these arguments. Simply stated, when we are immersed in a radio contest, we most probably can be in a Flow State. This state of mind often is referred to by athletes as being "in the zone".

A recent article by Richard Huskey, PhD, Department of Communications (!!!), University of California, Davis, reveals that he has spent the last 10 years studying the flow state and the changes it creates in the brain - how you can find it, and benefit from it. Being in a flow state requires that you put forth effort and drive the outcome. Certainly our contesting efforts would qualify.

Quoting Dr. Huskey: "One of the key attributes of the flow state, from which it derives many of its psychological benefits, is that while you're engaged in your activity, you're focused exclusively on it. The flow state occurs only when you're doing something that you're highly skilled at... and when you're doing it in a way that challenges that high skill level. Despite exerting themselves considerably, people in flow hardly notice their efforts. Time speeds up"

"Psychologists have learned a lot in recent years about what the brain looks like when in the flow state. Scientists have found strong evidence that when a person enters the flow state, activity decreases in the medial prefrontal cortex, an area of the brain associated with thinking about oneself. This evidence supports psychologists description of flow as a state of externally focused attention."

"We also have uncovered evidence that, during flow, the brain reconfigures itself so it requires less energy -- kind of a "battery-saver mode". That may explain why flow activities feel effortless and time flies while you are doing them".

Dr. Huskey reports that many benefits from being in flow have been observed or self-reported:

- Higher Skill --- Spending time in the flow state appears to make you better at the activity
- Mood Boost --- Being in flow just feels good. If you're having a crummy day, getting into flow for a spell can lift your spirits
- Increased Resiliance --- People who regularly experience flow appear better equipped to bounce back after disappointments
- Greater Productivity --- Frequent flow experiences appear to reduce procrastination, prevent burnout and increase motivation
- Mental Health --- Flow is associated with lower risk for anxiety and depression
- General Happiness --- People who often go into flow report greater life satisfaction"

Dr. Huskey adds: Find the sweet spot. Once you've decided on the activity that will be your conduit to the flow state, make a conscious decision to push yourself to the next level so that you're at that sweet spot between skill and challenge. If it's a game, seek out an opponent who's just a little better than you"....

And he summarizes his writings with words that are surely music to every contester's ears: "There's no such thing as spending too much time in the flow state. Frequently experiencing flow could make you happier, healthier, more productive and more skilled at your favorite tasks."

A Petition for Rulemaking has been filed by Cambium Networks and several non-profits to open the 10.0-10.5 GHz band for commercial use. They have made a nod to amateur radio, perhaps to minimize public opposition, by proposing a coordination system. — Chuck Till K4RGN via QRZ.COM News Forum,

Pa QSO Party 2022 in **Potter County**

Canonsburg, PA, October 10th, 2022 – Well another Pa Party is over and once again it was great fun for the five us Larry K3VX, Harold K3HCR, Mike WA3PYU, Kathy KA3VXM, and me W3WH. Granted, it's a four hour drive to Susquehannock Lodge, but it's well worth the effort.

We're able to use their "barn" for our operating and sleeping quarters except for Mike and Kathy who are housed in a separate building a short walk away. Our rooms are on the second floor with a deck outside our doors. This year we erected the 20/15/10 meter rotatable dipole above the deck about 11 or 12 feet. It seemed happy there and we made contacts easily with it. Next we put wires in convenient trees and mounted the Field Day 80/40 dipoles. The CW antennas were 37' above the ground and the phone wires were 57'high. We had no trouble being heard and the phone team received lots of "great signal " comments.

On Friday night we checked in to the 3910 kHz net and questioned a strange rule that limited a multi station to one signal any one band. A short time later the rule was amended allowing multiple signals on a single band. That has to be a record for a positive response to a troublesome rule. Congratulations to the Rules committee! The other thing we tried to do on Friday evening was to "network "our rigs to enable accurate serial numbers and avoid "dupes". We weren't successful so we used different blocks of serial numbers. One of our goals for next year is to fix that problem.

Don't even consider checking into the Susquehanock Lodge if you're on a diet. They serve two delicious meals every day and Kathy King brought meat balls and home made beef vegetable soup to help us keep up our strength between breakfast and dinner. Thank you Kathy. And then to make matters worse Harold came loaded with snacks. They were really good. Thanks Harold.

Our stations this year consisted of Harold's Yaesu FT-857, Bill's Icom 706 MK11G and FtDX10 with Mike's Elecraft K3 in reserve. They all worked well.

We had trouble with our K1EL computer interface which would have allowed our logging program to send the exchange automatically but instead we used Larry's magic box which does the same thing.

In case you're curious, yes we got our "clean sweep" for K3VX. We thought we got it last year but a logging error disallowed our only Clarion County contact which left us one short at 66 Counties in 2021. Hopefully this year we won't suffer the same fate. You might wonder how a King becomes a Queen. Well that's easy. Put Kathy King on the mike and she attracts QSO's like a light bulb attracts moths. Great job Kathy. Getting the last couple of needed counties is always a bit tense until they are in the satchel. This year they were Warren and Pike Counties which were worked by Harold and Mike. Yay!

It was a great weekend and if you haven't worked the "Party" you missed a great time and you owe it to yourself to get on next year during the second weekend of October.

Thanks to the group that runs the "Friendly QSO Party" for a job well done. See you next year.

MESAT-1 To Carry Linear Transponder


Washington, DC, October 30th, 2022 - An AMSAT-constructed linear transponder module is included in the MESAT 3U satellite to be deployed as part of NASA's upcoming ELaNa 43 mission.

MESAT-1 is a stack of three tech-stuffed 4-inch cubes assembled at the University of Maine and destined for space in 2022. The first satellite of its kind ever built in Maine, MESAT-1 carries three imaging experiments proposed by Maine schools and a 2-way radio for use by ground control and amateur radio enthusiasts.

MESAT-1 was originally projected to launch from Vandenberg Space Force Base, California, in June 2022, but has been delayed. The satellite will be carried by a Firefly Aerospace "Alpha" rocket and released into a Sun-synchronous orbit about 555 kilometers (350 miles) above Earth. It will fly nearly over the poles traveling at about 7.8 kilometers per second (17,000 mph), making a full orbit in roughly 100 minutes. Any given location on Earth will experience 4 to 6 passes per day, with each pass lasting less than 15 minutes. MESAT-1 is expected to remain in space for well over a decade.

The main radio aboard MESAT-1 is a linear transponder module (LTM-1) built by the nonprofit Radio Amateur Satellite Corporation (AMSAT), a partner in the project. The ground station operator will command the satellite through LTM-1 and the module will transmit telemetry back to Earth. LTM-1 will also be made available to amateur radio operators for 2-way communication.

The MESAT-1 proposal was accepted by NASA early in 2020. Dr. Ali Abedi, director of the WiSe-Net Lab at UMaine Orono, assigned three UMaine graduate students the task of producing the satellite. With the support of the Maine Space Grant Consortium, they completed MESAT-1 in time for a 2022 launch.

Myanmar, Burma, October 27^{th} , 2022 -- I bought an 18m (60') telescopic fiberglass mast from Spiderbeam last year, to go with my 12m (40') mast. To be honest, it was a PITA to get it sent to Thailand from Germany, and it was a double PITA to take it on planes, due to its length - I had to pay extra for the long length and extra for the weight!

Don't get me wrong, the mast itself is great, but normal plane travel with it is a hassle and expensive!

Finally, I was going to work in Myanmar, and it was impossible to take the mast with me. I decided to cut my losses and throw it away.... I put it in the trash barrel outside my rented room in Pattaya and went to Myanmar.



Well, after a time, I was back in Thailand. I went to visit Samui island and stayed there for a month, then moved to Bangkok, then finally stayed for a few days back in Pattaya before my planned move next week to stay on the island of Phangan and to operate with my Thai callsign – HSØZIB.

So I'm walking down the road in Pattaya and walk past my old rented room. Amazingly, I see my Spiderbeam mast, propped up next to the trash barrel because the trash collectors didn't want to take it! I'm driving/car ferry to Phangan, so I have plenty of room for the mast in my car. The mast has been laying out in the street for the past 4 months or so, and no-one has been interested to take it

So, the mast has been reunited with its owner, ready for my 160/80m vertical project on the beautiful island of Phangan

Power Line Chokes

Newington, CT, October 26th, 2022 – Keeping electromagnetic interference (EMI) out of power lines is important when using generators with radio gear.

Jim Brown K9YC provides guidance on constructing practical common-mode power-line chokes for this purpose, in his document, "A Ham's Guide to RFI, Ferrites, Baluns, and Audio Interfacing." I recently built a couple of the chokes shown in Fig 30a. If you're building one, you'll need at least 62 inches of Romex-type cable to make one of these with the three cores.

In email communication with Jim, he reiterates to not substitute wire type or cores, otherwise you'll be on your own for characterizing the performance of the chokes.



Cruciform drive screws have a head with two slots crossing. Some screws just have the two slots, some have slots and a dot or two, and sometimes the slots have a different shape where they cross. As long as you have a tool that will turn them, it's ok, right? Well, maybe, maybe not. There are different types, denoted by the markings on the screw heads, and for critical applications, you should always use the right tool for the right screw, especially if you want to avoid camout and damaging the slots. It's easy to geek out on this topic, but here's a Wikipedia article that provides a high-level overview of the various types.

Newington, CT, October 27th, 2022 – The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) announced this week that it is opening a new window for applications under its Honors Engineer Program. The one-year developmental program may lead to a term or permanent appointment.

The Commission is accepting applications from recent graduates with an engineering degree and current students graduating in December 2022.

Among the duties included in the job description is training to perform "propagation analysis of terrestrial, satellite and/or airborne systems or evaluating the emission characteristics of various transmitters to validate the coexistence with neighboring systems. Projects may also involve various computer software engineering and scientific applications.'

An FCC news release describes that honors engineers will work alongside senior staff on projects, including:

- Developing technical rules and policy approaches to enable the U.S. to introduce new communications technologies and services such as 5G, 6G, advanced Wi-Fi, the Internet of Things, next-generation TV broadcasting, and new broadband satellite systems;
- Facilitating wireless and wireline broadband service deployment throughout the nation, including to rural and underserved areas;
- Identifying technologies to improve access to communications services for all Americans, especially those with disabilities;
- Enabling public safety and homeland security agencies as well as various enterprises within various market sectors such as health care, energy, education, and transportation to introduce new communications technologies; and
- Developing policies that encourage innovation and investment in and transitions to new communications technologies, devices, and services that will support job creation and economic growth.

"Engineers are deployed throughout the FCC, and from space innovation to new broadcast standards to 6G and beyond, the FCC's policy portfolio is filled with interesting and challenging engineering work," said FCC Chairwoman Jessica Rosenworcel. "Our Honors Engineer program is a unique opportunity for the newest engineers to work closely with experienced professionals in this field to ensure that the FCC is best prepared to face the challenges of next-generation communications networks.3


